



Leominster Country

Leominster has a rich heritage to explore and a vibrant community life to enjoy. Highlights include:

- 1 The Priory Church**
Visit the Priory's fascinating Norman architecture and carvings, stunning stained-glass windows and Leominster's ancient ducking stool. At the heart of the town community, the Priory is both a place of worship and a much-loved venue for local events.
- 2 Grange Court**
Built in 1633 by John Abel, 'The King's Carpenter', this former market hall is one of Herefordshire's finest timber-framed buildings. It is now a fully-accessible community, heritage and enterprise hub, owned by the people of Leominster through the LARC Development Trust.
- 3 The Grange**
Previously part of the medieval Priory enclosure, this picturesque open space has been a firm favourite with residents and visitors for hundreds of years. Located just a few minutes' walk from town centre shops and cafes, the Grange is an ideal spot for a picnic or a leisurely stroll.
- 4 Leominster Community Centre**
Home to the Playhouse Cinema and the Leominster Theatre Company, the Community Centre hosts a wide range of workshops, classes and social events.
- 5 The Forbury Chapel**
Explore this unique 13th century building, which throughout its history has been a court, school, theatre, legal offices, place of worship and community space.

- 6 Corn Square**
Corn Square has hosted Leominster's thriving markets for many centuries. It is home to our Tourist Information Centre and some of the oldest timber-framed buildings in the town.
- 7 Leominster Museum**
Leominster Museum is a treasure-house of local memories and artifacts. For further information on seasonal opening times, visit the Museum website or contact the Tourist Information Centre in Corn Square.
- 8 Leominster Library**
Access a full range of library services, including free internet access points.

Open Spaces

Leominster has some beautiful parks and green spaces to enjoy, all within an easy walk of the town centre.

Walking Trails
